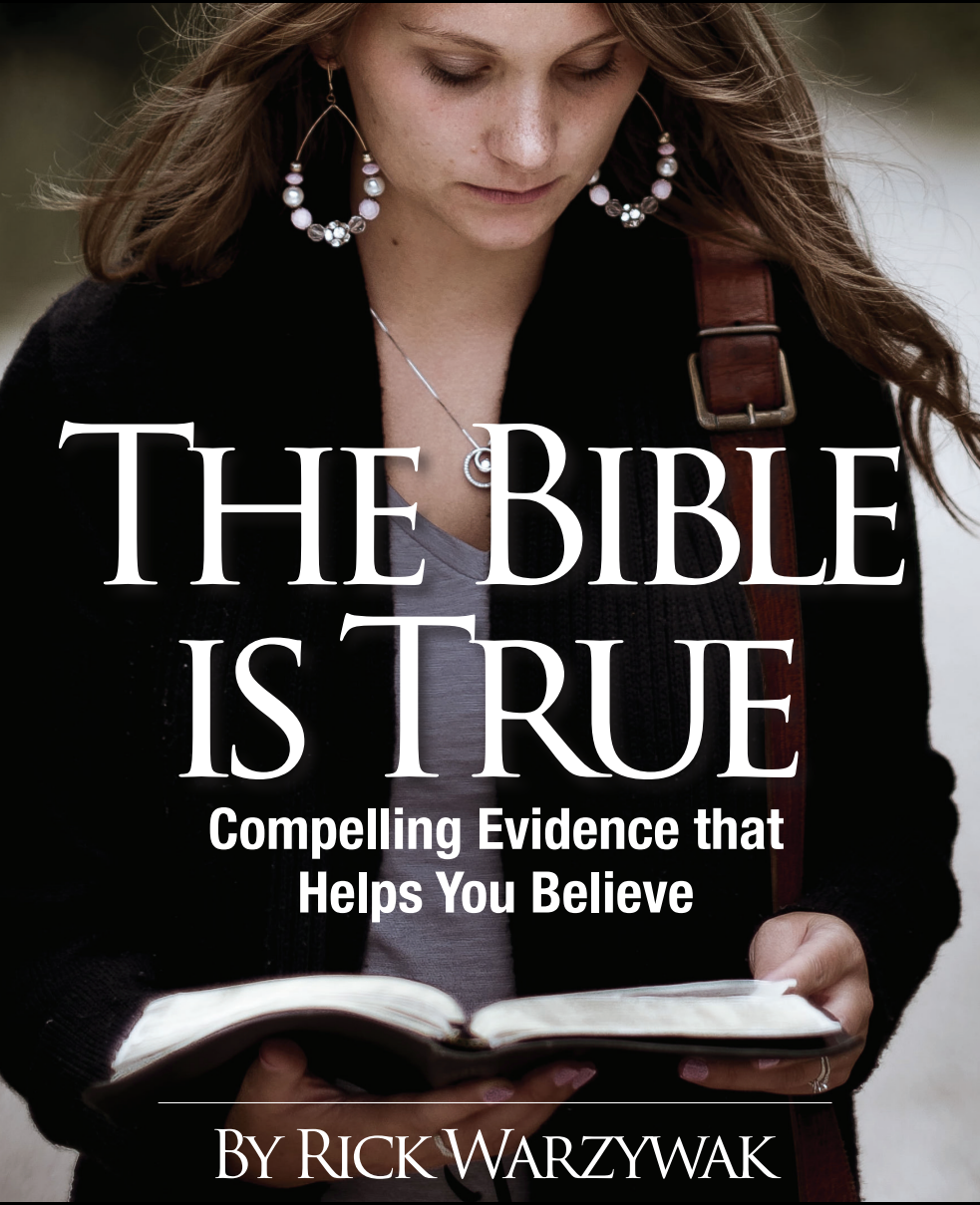

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The Author's Journey

I attended my first funeral when I was seven. The image of a lifeless body in a casket impacted me. I began to have questions in my mind regarding life and death. As I grew older, I started to ponder questions about life after death. The home I was raised in was not a religious one. My dad would take me to church mainly on Christmas and Easter. The Bible and eternity were never discussed

As I entered high school, these questions became buried in the back of my mind. During my junior year, I began dating my future wife, Barbara (we have now been married for 56 years). She attended church more regularly and had a greater spiritual sensitivity than I did. I give her credit for my spiritual search. As I began attending college, a party-life mentality consumed me. One day on campus, a student came up to me and very directly witnessed the gospel. I rejected it.

After we married in 1970, Barbara began a spiritual search in astrology, yoga, meditation, and what was then called New Age. You could say I was along for the ride, just living life. I did not own or read a Bible. However, her searching began to stir up thoughts of life and death.

Barbara found a job working for a hairdresser who was a Christian. As patrons came in, she overheard many conversations. Eventually the salon owner began sharing her faith, discussing Scriptures and answering her questions. Soon after, upon my return from a sales trip, Barbara told me that she had become a Christian. When she described what had happened, it melted my heart.

However, by the next day I was angry because this new development would alter my party-like lifestyle. But Barbara stood strong and talked me into going to church. I was somewhat resistant, with arms folded, as I sat in the meeting. But, the living Word of God began to penetrate my hardened heart.

One day, a few men from church came over to help me with home projects. As they shared the gospel with me, I felt awakened to who Jesus Christ was, and on that day, I was saved. Those old questions—and new ones—began to resurface. My frustration was that answers were hard to come by from those who were seasoned Christians. A friend invited us to a weekly Bible study whose teacher was not part of the church I was attending. He answered all of my questions. I began to dig deeper and deeper into the Word of God.

In this journey, I heard about campus evangelists Jed and Cindy Smock. I took my son to Michigan State University to hear the Smocks preach the Word of God. This experience planted the seed in me to go to university campuses and the streets to preach the gospel. Jed and Cindy invited me to Ohio where they trained and encouraged me. After that experience I felt called to leave my job and share the Word on university campuses. Our lives radically changed.

CHAPTER 1

Laws of Common Probability



If anyone examines the over 300 prophecies given about the coming of Christ in the Old Testament—centuries before the actual birth of Christ—they would soon have to acknowledge that the Bible is the Word of God.

Principles of Probability

The field of statistics and probability has its rules, definitions, and formulas that can be used to predict possible outcomes and events or combinations of these. To determine probability, you need to analyze by adding, subtracting, multiplying, or dividing the data that describes the original events. You may have a process for making predictions and do this so often that it's automatic. The better you understand the ideas behind the formulas, the more likely you'll be able to use them successfully.

Probability is the branch of mathematics concerning events and their likelihood of occurring. The theory of probability has been debated for centuries: in 1600, French mathematicians used the rules of probability to place and win bets. Subsequently, the knowledge of probability has significantly evolved and is now an essential tool for statistics.

2 Laws of Common Probability

Properly applied, the laws of probability can give us insight into the workings of nature and our everyday world. Probability tells us how often events will happen after many repeated trials. You experience probability when you flip a coin, roll dice, or look at a weather forecast.

Today, mathematical probability is used by companies in insurance, health, economics, science, investment, psychology, statistics, leisure, and entertainment—you name it—to make important decisions. Another way to explain this concept would be to ask, “What are the odds that something could happen?” Let’s look at an example of statistical probability.

One of **the greatest proofs of the Bible’s authenticity** is the study of statistics regarding the laws of common probability. Take one single event that would be predicted about Jesus Christ (New Testament recordings) in the Old Testament. Say that laws of probability revealed the chance of this single event occurring randomly was 1:5. If another event in the Old Testament about Jesus Christ had the probability of 1:10, the chances of these occurring together in sequence is five multiplied by 10. So, the combined chance of both of these events or prophecies occurring in order is 1:50.

We’ll review 17 easily understood prophecies in the Old Testament. The fulfillment of these 17 prophecies related to a single individual is an astronomical absurdity. Together, the chance of these predictions occurring is a **combined probability of one in 480,000,000,000,000,000,000,000,000,000,000,000,000,000**, or one chance in 480 billion x 1 billion x 1 trillion!

If we take 48 of the major predictions regarding the promised Messiah, the number would be so large that our minds could not comprehend it. The conservative odds are the number 1 followed by 157 zeros.

So, why do so many still question the validity of the Bible? **The fact is that people are willingly ignorant and fail to consider even the most obvious proofs.** Recognizing that the Word of God is true puts people in a position of accountability and dependence—and that requires introspection, change, and even a transformation of someone’s life.

The following 17 prophecies are Biblical predictions given about Jesus Christ, centuries before He lived.

4 Laws of Common Probability

REMEMBER: These 17 predictions (astronomical phenomenon) give us a combined probability of one chance in 480,000,000,000,000,000,000,000,000,000,000,000 or one chance in 480 billion x 1 billion x 1 trillion. **And there are over 300 fulfilled prophecies in the Bible. No other religious writing can make this claim.**

God set in His Word the exact plan and coming of the Messiah, years before He physically came to earth. To the believer it is a confidence builder; to the searcher, it is powerful information that cannot be ignored. The Kingdom of God was brought to mankind in a very deliberate, calculated, and specific way—promised and delivered. These predictions were fulfilled by and through a divine plan, not by chance!

CHAPTER 2

Scientific Evidence



The Bible + Science, Evidence Presented

“In antiquity and in what is called the Dark Ages, man did not know what they now know about humanity and the cosmos. They did not know the lock, but they possessed the key, which is God. Now many have excellent descriptions of the lock, but they have lost the key. The proper solution is a union between religion and science. We should be owners of the lock and the key. The fact is that as science advances, it discovers what was said thousands of years ago in the Bible”

(Richard Wurmbrand, “Proofs of God’s Existence”).

The Bible + Science in the Book of Genesis

Scientists admit Genesis is “close to the truth,” and they get a little nervous when they realize that their discoveries lead them back to the very beginning of Genesis. Notice the use of the word uncanny in the following quotes:

“Most cosmologists (scientists who study the structures and evolution of the universe) agree that the Genesis account of creation, in imaging and initial void, may be uncannily close to the truth” (Time, Dec. 1976).

“The universe suddenly exploded into being... The big bang bears an uncanny resemblance to the Genesis command” (Jim Holt, Wall Street Journal).

The Book of Genesis Explains the Origin of the Sexes

Almost all forms of complex life are both male and female: humans, dogs, horses, moths, monkeys, fish, elephants, birds, etc. The male needs the female to reproduce, and the female needs the male to reproduce. One cannot carry on life without the other. The Bible tells us that *“He who made them at the beginning made them male and female”* (Matthew 19:4).

But if evolution is true, which came first according to evolutionary theory? If a male came into being before a female, how did the male of each species reproduce without females? How is it possible that a male and a female each spontaneously came into being, with very complex, complementary reproductive systems? If each sex was able to reproduce without the other, why—and how—would they have developed a reproductive system that requires both sexes for the species to survive?

The Book of Genesis + the Universe

Science expresses the universe in five terms: time, power, space, matter, and motion. Genesis 1:1-2 perfectly revealed these truths to the Hebrews: *“In the beginning (time) God created (power) the heavens (space) and the earth (matter). And the Spirit of God moved (motion) upon the face of the waters.”* The first thing God explains is that He controls all aspects of the universe.

Early Scientists who Believed in Bible Authenticity

Many of the great scientists of the past who founded and developed key disciplines of science were creationists. Yes, creationists.

- Physics – Newton, Faraday, Maxwell, Kelvin
- Chemistry – Boyle, Dalton, Ramsay
- Biology – Ray, Linnaeus, Mendel, Pasteur
- Geology – Steno, Woodward, Brewster, Agassiz
- Astronomy – Kepler, Galileo, Herschel, Maunder

“These men, as well as scores of others who could be mentioned, were creationists, not evolutionists, and their names are practically synonymous with the rise of modern science. To them, the scientific enterprise was a high calling, one dedicated to thinking God’s thoughts after Him” (Henry Morris and Gary Parker, *“What Is Creation Science?”*).

The Bible + the Universal Flood of Noah

How do you account for billions of dead things that have been fossilized in a sedimentary rock layer, which covers the highest mountain peaks and lowest sea level areas in the world? “About 85% of the rock surface around the world is made up of sedimentary rock, indicating that at some time in the past, the world was covered by water” (Peter and Paul Lalonde, *“301 Startling Proofs & Prophecies”*).

Note: The vast majority of cultures in the world have a record of a universal flood!

The Bible in Genesis Differentiates People from Animals

The Bible tells us that animals are created “without understanding.” Humans are made in God’s image. We aren’t merely a higher form of species on the evolutionary scale. As human beings, we are aware of our “being.” God is “I AM,” and we know that “we are.” We have an advanced understanding that we exist.

Among other unique characteristics, we have an innate ability to appreciate God’s creation. What animal gazes with awe at a sunset or at the magnificence of the Grand Canyon? What animal obtains joy from the sounds of music or takes the time to form an orchestra to create and harmonize music? What animal among beasts sets up court systems and apportions justice to its fellow creatures? We are complex, intelligent beings accountable to a Creator God.

“For since the creation of the world, His invisible attributes are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even His eternal power and Godhead, so that they are without excuse” (Romans 1:20).

While birds and other creatures have instincts to create, like nesting, we have the ability to uncover complex systems, such as the hidden laws of electricity. We can use the law of aerodynamics to transport ourselves around the globe. We unearth the hidden treasures of gold, silver, diamonds, and oil and expand their use for our benefit. Only humans have the unique capability to appreciate God for these incredible creations and to respond to His resources and love.

The Bible Speaks of One Common Ancestor

“Researchers suggest that virtually all modern men are closely related genetically and share genes with one male ancestor, dubbed ‘Ychromosome Adam.’ We are finding out that humans have very shallow genetic roots that go back very recently to one ancestor... that indicates there was an origin in a specific location on the globe, and then it spread out from there” (*U.S. News & World Report*, Dec. 4, 1995).

POINT TO PONDER: XX = Female and XY = Male

The human genome cannot be altered. You are what you are at birth! Altering your body does not alter your sex. *“And He said to them, ‘Have you not read that He who made them at the beginning made them male and female,’ and said, ‘For this reason, a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh?’ So then, they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore, what God has joined together, let no man separate”* (Matthew 19:4-6).

The Bible Reveals that the Earth is Round

The Scriptures tell us that the earth is round: *“It is He that sits upon the circle of the earth”* (Isaiah 40:22). The word “circle” translated is the Hebrew word *chuwg*, which is also translated circuit or compass depending on the context.

That is, it indicates something spherical, rounded, or arched—not something that is flat or square. The Book of Isaiah was written sometime between 740 and 680 B.C. This was at least 300 years before Aristotle suggested in his book, *On the Heavens*, that the earth might be a sphere. It was another 2,000 years later (at a time when science believed that the earth was flat) that the Scriptures inspired Christopher Columbus to sail around the world.

The Bible + Earth’s Free-Float in Space

At a time when it was believed that the earth sat on a large animal or a giant (1500 B.C.), the Bible spoke of the earth’s free-float in space: *“He... hangs the earth upon nothing”* (Job 26:7). Science didn’t discover that the earth hangs upon nothing until 1650.

Only in recent years has science discovered that everything we see is composed of things that we cannot see—invisible atoms. The Bible corresponds with what is known as quantum physics. In Hebrews 11:3, written 2,000 years ago, Scripture tells us that the “things which are seen were not made of things which do appear.”

The Bible + the Science of Oceanography

Matthew Maury (1806-1873) was considered the father of oceanography. He noticed the expression “*paths of the sea*” in Psalm 8:8, written 2,800 years ago: “*If God said there are paths in the sea, I am going to find them.*” Maury then took God at His word and went looking for those paths, and we are indebted to his discovery of the warm and cold continental currents. His book on oceanography remains a basic text on the subject and is used in universities.

The Bible + the First Law of Thermodynamics

The Scriptures say, “*Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all the host of them*” (Genesis 2:1). The original Hebrew uses the past definite tense for the verb “finished,” indicating an action completed in the past, never to occur again. The creation was finished—once and for all. That is exactly what the first law of thermodynamics says. This law, often referred to as the law of conservation of energy, states that neither matter nor energy can be either created or destroyed.

It was because of this law that Sir Fred Hoyle’s “steady state” or “continuous creation” theory was discarded. Hoyle stated that at points in the universe matter or energy was constantly being created. But, the first law states just the opposite. Indeed, there is no “creation” ongoing today. “**It is finished**” exactly as the Bible states.

The Bible + the Law of Entropy

Three different places in the Bible (Isaiah 51:6, Psalm 102:25, Hebrews 1:11) indicate that the earth is wearing out and this supports the second law of science, the principle of entropy. The laws of thermodynamics describe that all systems and elements of the universe tend to disintegrate to a lower order of available energy or organization. Everything is running down and wearing out as energy is becoming less and less available for use.

All things, whether a house or a sword, will disintegrate to dust or rust—a lower order of organization than the original house or sword. Throughout history, mankind has observed that everything—from the human body to a castle—begins to decay from the moment of maximum order at the beginning until, years later, the object stops functioning.

When you think about this universal principle, you can immediately see that the theory of evolution can’t be true. Evolution suggests that simple systems and elements become increasingly more organized and complicated by random chance. However, common sense and scientific observation have proven that all systems and elements over time tend to degenerate. In fact, the law of entropy proves that the theory of evolution is nonsense.

10 Scientific Evidence

Consider the implications. The law of conservation of energy proves that the universe could not have created itself. It had to be created by a supernatural force outside the universe. *"In the beginning, God created heaven and the earth"* (Genesis 1:1). The law of entropy, however, shows that the whole universe is running down as it decays to a lower order of available energy. This fact reveals that the universe must have been created at some point in the past and has been running down like a clock ever since that initial moment of creation. The current evolutionary theory that presumes the universe was created from nothing by itself is contradicted by all known laws of science.

In addition, the law of entropy reveals that the universe must have been created at some definite point to account for the scientific observation confirming continual decay.

The Bible + Day/Night Time Astronomy

The Gospel writer Luke described the coming of Christ in the daytime: *"Even thus shall it be on the day when the Son of man is revealed"* (Luke 17:30). Luke described the same event by declaring that Christ will come in the night: *"I tell you, in that night there shall be two men in one bed; the one shall be taken, and the other shall be left"* (Luke 17:34). To the natural mind of his day, Luke's words must have sounded like a contradiction. How could a single event, the coming of the Messiah, occur simultaneously in the day and in the night? Luke's statement must have appeared impossible and contradictory from the early centuries. However, we now understand that **on whatever day Christ returns, it could be a daytime event for those on one side of the globe while at night for those living on the other side of the planet—different time zones.** How could Luke have known this scientific fact 2,000 years ago?

The Scriptures declare the sun moved *"in his circuit unto the ends of it."* Recent discoveries by the Hubble telescope confirmed the accuracy of the Scriptures when they proved that the sun actually moves through space in a circuit covering an enormous orbit that lasts over 260 million years.

One of the most curious scientific revelations in the Bible regarding astronomy was pointed out by David Harris, an astronomer from Toronto. This statement is found in the Book of Amos, noting the seven stars in the constellation known as Pleiades. *"Seek Him that maketh the seven stars and Orion"* (Amos 5:8). The King James Version translators confirmed that Amos's original Hebrew statement about the seven stars referred to the constellation Pleiades. However, modern translators render this verse as *"He made the Pleiades and Orion"* (NKJV).

Early translators were puzzled by this verse because there were only six stars that could be seen by the naked eye in the constellation Pleiades. Now, however, modern telescopes have revealed the existence of a seventh star in the Pleiades; it is so dim that only a telescope can detect it. **How else did Amos know that there were seven stars in the constellation unless God told him?** The Bible was correct all along in its description of seven stars as recorded by the prophet Amos over 25 centuries ago.

The Bible + the Law of Conservation of Energy

After exhaustive experiments, modern scientists have developed two fundamental laws of the science of thermodynamics that describe the nature of our known universe. The first is the law of conservation of energy, which reveals that energy can be neither created nor destroyed. This law was best explained by science writer Isaac Asimov: "Energy can be transferred from one place to another, or transformed from one form to another, but it can neither be created nor destroyed."

In other words, this law states the whole amount of energy that exists throughout our universe remains constant and can never change. When scientists explode a nuclear device, for example, the uranium and plutonium within the warhead are not annihilated. The matter is simply transformed into a staggering release of heat and light energy. Every experiment has confirmed this law of conservation of energy as the most basic fundamental understanding of how the universe works. This law describes the present state of the universe after its initial creation by God.

Although this fundamental law of the universe was only discovered and proven scientifically during the last century, the Word of God recorded this principle thousands of years ago. Moses wrote in Genesis: "*And on the seventh day God ended His work which He had made, and He rested on the seventh day from all His work which He had made. So God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it God rested from all His work that He created and made*" (Genesis 2:2,3).

This inspired passage aligns with the law of conservation of energy: after God created man on the sixth day, "*He rested from all His work that He had made.*" His work was complete.

In addition, the Scriptures reveal why nothing can now be totally destroyed because Jesus Christ, who created all things, is "*upholding all things by the word of His power*" (Hebrews 1:3). In another passage, the writer of the Book of Hebrews declared that Jesus, the Creator of the universe, had finished His acts of creation: "*For whoever has entered God's rest has also rested from his works as God did from His*" (Hebrews 4:10).

The Bible + the Laws of Hygiene

In 1845, a young doctor in Vienna named Ignaz Semmelweis was horrified at the terrible death rate of women who gave birth in hospitals. As many as 30% died after childbirth. Semmelweis noted that doctors would examine the bodies of patients who died without washing their hands, go straight to the next ward, and then examine expectant mothers. This was their normal practice because the presence of microscopic diseases was unknown. Semmelweis insisted that doctors wash their hands before each exam, and the death rate immediately dropped to 2%.

Look at the specific instructions God gave thousands of years ago to His people for when they encountered disease: *“And when he that has an issue is cleansed of his issue; then he shall number to himself seven days for his cleansing, and wash his clothes, bathe his flesh in running water, and shall be clean”* (Leviticus 15:13). Until recent years, doctors washed their hands in a bowl of water, leaving invisible germs on their hands. However, the Bible says specifically to wash under running water.

The Bible + the Correlation of Mind and Body

Medical science has come to understand that there is a strong relationship between a person’s mental and physical health. The Bible revealed this to us with these and other statements written around 950 B.C.:

“A sound heart is the life of the flesh: but envy is the rottenness of the bones” (Proverbs 14:30).

“The light of the eyes rejoices the heart: and a good report makes the bones fat and healthy” (Proverbs 15:30).

“Pleasant words are as a honeycomb, sweet to the soul, and health to the bones” (Proverbs 16:24).

“A merry heart does good like a medicine: but a broken spirit dries the bones” (Proverbs 17:22).

The Bible + Bacteria

“And... neither shall you eat any flesh that is torn from beasts in the field; you shall cast it to the dogs” (Exodus 22:31). Thousands of years before modern science identified bacteria, God made provision for Israel by banning the eating of meat that could be spoiled by bacteria.

The Bible + Meteorological Laws

The Scriptures describe a “cycle of air currents” 2,000 years before scientists discovered them: *“The wind blows to the south, and goes around to the north; it whirls about continually, and the wind returns again according to his circuits”* (Ecclesiastes 1:6). We now know that air around the earth turns in huge circles, clockwise in one hemisphere and counterclockwise in the other.

The Bible + the Water Cycle

The Scriptures inform us, *“All streams run into the sea, but the sea is not full; to the place where the streams flow, there they return again”* (Ecclesiastes 1:7). This statement alone may not seem profound. But when considered with other biblical passages, it becomes all the more remarkable.

For example, the Mississippi River dumps approximately 518 billion gallons of water every 24 hours into the Gulf of Mexico. Where does all that water go? And that’s just one of thousands of rivers. The answer lies in the hydrologic cycle, so well described in the Bible. Ecclesiastes 11:3 states that *“if the clouds are full of rain, they empty themselves upon the earth.”*

Look at the Bible’s concise words in Amos 9:6: *“Who calls for the waters of the sea, and pours them out on the face of the earth—The Lord is His name.”* The idea of a complete water cycle was not fully understood by science until the 17th century. However, more than 2,000 years before the discoveries of Pierre Perrault, Edmund Mariotte, Edmund Halley, and others, the Scriptures clearly spoke of a water cycle.

The Bible + the Incredible Book of Job

The Book of Job, among the oldest recorded books of the Bible (1520 B.C.), is filled with scientific facts that outline contemporary thought. This book addresses concepts of earth science and physics before modern discoveries were even documented.

Job + the Springs of the Sea

“Modern deep-sea diving cameras have discovered amazing hot-water vents on the floor of the oceans, the springs of the sea, which are mentioned in Job 38:16. These thermal vents release huge amounts of mineral-rich, superheated water—springs in the darkness.”

The Book of Job + Light

“Sir Isaac Newton studied light and discovered that white light is made of seven colors, which can be separated from the white (see Job 38:24), and then recombined to make white again. Science discovered this in 1650.” —Richard Gunther

The Book of Job + the Speed of Light

The Book of Job 38:19 asks, “Where is the way where light dwells?” Modern man has only recently discovered that light (electromagnetic radiation) has a “way”—or light speed—in empty space. This speed is approximately 186,000 miles per second.

The Book of Job + the Dinosaurs

Why did dinosaurs disappear? Science can only speculate. However, the answer may be in Job 40:15-24. In this passage, God Himself speaks of a great creature called “behemoth.” Some Bible commentators think this is a reference to the hippopotamus. However, one of the characteristics of this massive animal is that it had a tail the size of a large tree. The hippo’s tail isn’t like a tree; it is more like a small twig.

Other given characteristics of this huge animal were: it was the largest of all the creatures God made, it was plant-eating (herbivorous), and it had its strength in its hips. It had very strong bones, lived among the trees, drank massive amounts of water, and was not disturbed by a raging river. It appeared impervious to attack because its nose could pierce through snares. But Scripture says, “He that made him can make his sword to approach unto him” (Job 40:19). In other words, God caused this, the largest of all the creatures He had made, to become extinct.

The Book of Job + Air Mass

“Scripture tells us in Job 28:25 that there is ‘*a weight for the wind.*’ Long before it was recognized that the air had weight (16th century), the Bible said that it did. It also tells us that water has weight. The fact that so much water covers the earth means that the effects of the sun and moon’s gravity are balanced perfectly. The energy is dissipated in the water—the weight of the water is precisely measured.” - Richard Gunther

The Book of Job + the Earth's Rotation

For ages, scientists believed in a geocentric view of the universe. The differences between night and day were believed to be caused by the sun revolving around the earth. Today, we know that the earth's rotation on its axis is responsible for the sun's rising and setting. But 4,000 years ago, it was written, "*Have you commanded the morning since your days, and caused the day spring [dawn] to know his place? It [the earth] is turned as clay to the seal*" (Job 38:12,14). The picture here is of a clay vessel being turned or rotated upon the potter's wheel—an accurate analogy of the earth's rotation.

CHAPTER 3

Archaeological Findings



Does Archaeology Prove the Bible is True?

Archaeology has been called “the Bible’s best friend,” a statement that reflects the long history of discoveries that support biblical records. From the discovery of the Cyrus Cylinder in 1879 to the Dead Sea Scrolls in 1947 to the Pool of Siloam in 2004, archaeology has worked hand in hand with Bible scholars to provide an independent witness to the truth of God’s Word.

Unfortunately for skeptics, archaeology has unearthed a mountain of evidence that proves that the Bible is not a collection of ancient fairy tales but an honest record of historical events. The authors of the Bible make many archaeological claims. More than 50 people mentioned in the Bible have been confirmed through archaeological discoveries. This chapter shows how archaeology confirms and supports the Bible.

The great majority of supposed contradictions among the Bible, history, and archaeology are untrue or have been proven false. Some archaeological discoveries seem to contradict the Bible. Is it archaeology or the Bible that is in error? In such cases, remember that archaeologists are people, too, with their limitations, biases, and proneness to error. When an artifact is found, its existence and location must be interpreted, and it is the process of interpretation that is liable to mistakes.

THE GREATEST DISCOVERY OF ALL – NOAH’S ARK



Noah's Ark, which some have called a fairy tale or legend, has been found in the location the Bible refers to as the mountains of Ararat (Genesis 8:4). Noah's Ark is the ship in the Genesis flood narrative through which God spares Noah, his family, and examples of all the world's animals from a global deluge. The ark was hidden for centuries by glacial snow and ice. An earthquake in 1978 caused the earth to settle, exposing the ark's ribs. In 1986, radar scans revealed the pattern of a structure. Turkey officially dedicated the site as Noah's Ark in 1987. In 2014, radar scans revealed a massive boat shape under the ground.

God gave Noah the dimensions of the 1.5 million cubic-foot ark he was to build. A ship was built after that same pattern in 1609 in Holland, revolutionizing shipbuilding. By 1900, every large ship on the high seas was inclined toward the proportions of the ark, verified by "Lloyd's Register of Shipping" in the World Almanac. This is further proof of biblical accuracy and authenticity.

CHAPTER 4

Mathematical Proof



Panin, who passed away in October 1942, after 50 years of work with the Bible Numerica, was not the first to discover that there was a remarkable mathematical structure running through the Bible. Browne (a chronological scholar) in his *Ordo Saeculorum*, Grant (a numeric scholar) in his *Numerical Bible*, and Bullinger (a numeric scholar) in his *Numbers on the Scriptures*, all brought forth many striking examples of numeric features in the Bible. Panin demonstrated that every letter of the Hebrew and Greek manuscripts is numbered and occupies its own special place in the order of the total letters in the Bible. And because each letter carries a specific numerical value, every word, phrase, sentence, and paragraph has a definite mathematical sum.

Panin's extensive work of the series of complex systems using sequences, combinations, and ratios that follow a uniform design—from Genesis to Revelation—is undoubtedly God's response to atheism and higher criticisms. This arithmetical wonder exhibits the inspiration of Scripture.

The doctrine of the Divine authority of the Scriptures is fully sustained by proofs from fulfilled prophecy—from its matchless power over the lives of people to its indestructibility regarding the testimony of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. However, some critics have been trying to waive these lines of evidence aside as unscientific.

Panin submitted conclusive scientific proof that the Bible could not have been produced by the unaided human mind. This proof is found in the amazing numeric phenomena in the structure of the Greek and Hebrew manuscripts. Panin demonstrated that either every writer of Scripture was an unparalleled literary and mathematical genius or that they wrote while moved by the Holy Spirit. Professor John C. Banks, a worthy successor of Panin, offered numeric evidence of the same proof.

Panin presented his discoveries to readers far and wide with the challenge to disprove, if possible, this numerical phenomenon. Since that time many other skeptics have been confronted with the same evidence and not one has been able to discredit the work. Some challenged Panin to find the same mathematical structure in Hebrew and Greek classics outside of the Bible. So, he researched further. No other writings contained these phenomena in them. (No such features were found in the seven books added by the Roman Catholic Church to their Old Testament, either.)

Certain numbers, and where they are placed, have special value and meaning in the Bible. The number seven, for example, is significant and is found throughout the universe. Seven is the number of the Creator and the number of fullness, rest, and completeness. Not only is this law of seven found running throughout creation, but it is found many times in Scripture. Students of the Bible have often been amazed to find this number appearing in unexpected ways.

Panin's work never dealt with translations but examined Hebrew and Greek. Translation difficulties have been tremendous. The constant change in language usage has rendered many words in our English translation practically obsolete (and that's why you see many modern Bible translations today). But how could Panin get back to the originals? The answer is that the comparison of hundreds of manuscripts preserved for us shows a uniformity that proves one common source.

Samples of Panin's Numerical Phenomena:

- The number of words in the vocabulary is divisible by the number seven.
- The number of words beginning with a vowel is divisible by seven.
- The number of words beginning with a consonant is divisible by seven.
- The number of letters in the vocabulary is divisible by seven.
- Of those letters, the vowels and consonants are both divisible by seven.
- The number of words in the vocabulary occurring more than once is divisible by seven. Those occurring only once likewise are divisible by seven.
- The number of words occurring in more than one form is divisible by seven. The number occurring in only one form is also divisible by seven.
- The number of proper names is divisible by seven. The male names are divisible by seven. The female names are divisible by seven.

The Bible was written in two languages: the Old Testament in Hebrew (a few chapters in Chaldean for numeric purposes) and the New Testament in Greek. Both of these languages have this peculiarity: they have no separate symbols for numbers corresponding to modern Arabic figures 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 0. In their place, they use the letters in their alphabet so that each Hebrew and Greek letter also stands for a certain number. This is called the numeric value of the letter. As each word consists of letters, the numeric value of a word is the sum of the numeric values of its letters. The numeric value of a sentence, paragraph, chapter, or book is the sum of the numeric values of these words.

Using these numeric values, they performed all of their numeric operations. But in Scripture, an additional system is used for numeric construction of the text—place values. The place value of a letter, whether Hebrew or Greek, is the number of the place the letter occupies in the alphabet. Accordingly, in Hebrew, place values and numeric values of the first 10 letters are the same. And the same is the case with the first five letters in Greek.

The 11th Hebrew letter, for example, does not stand for 11, but 20. Accordingly, its numeric value is 20, but its place value is 11. The last letter of the Hebrew alphabet, the 22nd, stands for 400. Accordingly, its numeric value is 400, as its place value is 22. The same applies to the Greek alphabet. Its sixth letter stands for seven; this is its numeric value, but its place value is six.

The full value of a Hebrew or Greek letter or word is the sum of its numeric and place values. The value of the word “Jesus” in Greek is 975, of which the numeric value is 888, and the place value is 87. Now note further features:

- The numerical value of the vocabulary is divisible by seven.
- The numerical value of the various alphabetical groups of words is divisible by seven.
- The numerical value of the various forms in which the words occur produce the same phenomenon.

POINT TO PONDER: The above enumeration barely touches the surface of the numerics Panin brought to light. He challenged anyone to write one paragraph of 300 words intelligently and produce some numeric phenomena of similar designs, and complete it in six months. Any person who could do it would prove to be a wonder. No one offered!

But many of the Scripture writers were men chosen from very ordinary walks of life, having little or no schooling. If Matthew, Mark, Luke, or John, for example, had attempted to write by unaided human wisdom and produced the harmonious numeric features found throughout their books, how long would it have taken them? With each additional sentence, the difficulty of constructing literary works using this plan increases in mathematical and geometrical progression. They contrived to write each paragraph to develop constantly fixed numeric relations to what goes before and comes after.

But even more amazing: the number of words found in Matthew, not found in any other New Testament book, displays elaborate numeric design. How did Matthew know that he had used unique words that would not be used in any of the other 26 books? He would've needed to be the last writer, after studying and comparing all of the other books.

It so happens, however, that each of the other books of the Bible shows the same phenomena. Did each writer write last? If not, then, was each of the writers a mind reader as well as an unequaled literary and mathematical genius? This is hardly even conceivable!

Panin proceeded to prove by numerics that every book of the Bible carries such features, each one being necessary to cause the numerical scheme of the entire Bible to work out correctly. Furthermore, nothing can be added to or subtracted from the Bible, as we have it, without spoiling these features. From the first verse in Genesis to the last verse of Revelation, these divine evidences are loud and clear. The God of nature is, therefore, proved to be the God of Scripture. If you're still skeptical, it's not toward believers of the Bible but toward God Himself.

Note: Panin's exhaustive works were voluminous and his discoveries seemingly without end. He authored a volume, "Structure on the Bible," and New Testament revisions based upon his numeric discoveries. Since his death, the Nobel Research Foundation reviewed over 43,000 sheets of his penned work and assigned Greek and Hebrew scholars to further pursue these studies. Subsequently a book was published on the subject.

CHAPTER 5

Historical Record



Evidence for Over 100 Biblical Characters in Secular History

The Bible is not written as a history book, but it is a book that contains much history. Many call it the greatest history book ever written. Noted historical figures are identified in its pages. Among the most conservative lists, there are more than 100 biblical characters that can be conclusively identified within secular history.

The Bible is a collection of 66 books written by more than 40 authors over more than 1,500 years. Given the volume and span of time, it is amazingly accurate when it comes to its historical record. From casual readers to students of the Bible, all readily see much historical proof and supporting evidence within its pages. The composition alone supports one single and Divine origin.

Historical Evidence for Jesus Christ

Confirming more than 100 biblical characters in secular history is impressive and provides remarkable proof for the validity of Scripture. But what about the central figure of the Bible, Jesus Christ? Does history confirm that such a man lived, performed miracles, died by crucifixion, and was resurrected from the dead? A number of Roman historians mention Christ. They wrote in the second century and were born within 50 years of the death of Christ.

Tacitus Confirms Christ as the Founder of Christianity

Publius Cornelius Tacitus was a prominent Roman senator who was born in A.D. 56. His most famous historical work, *Annals*, was published in 115-116. Tacitus confirms the connection between Christ and Pilate and agrees with the biblical record that this took place during the reign of Tiberius. Tacitus was no fan of Christ or Christianity. What Tacitus wrote confirmed the existence of Jesus Christ as the founder of the Christian movement. He confirms that Pontius Pilate was the governor who convicted Christ and condemned Him to crucifixion (Matthew 27:2-22). He also confirms that all of this happened during the reign of Tiberius Caesar (Luke 3:1). Each character and date lines up with the Bible.

Pliny Confirms the Existence of Christ

Pliny the Younger, whose full name was Gaius Plinius Caecilius Secundus, was a Roman senator and was appointed governor of Bithynia and Pontus in A.D. 110. In his position as governor, he wrote numerous letters to Emperor Trajan asking for advice. A letter that is relevant to this article is found in his last and 10th book of "Letters," and it contains references to Christians and Jesus Christ. During this time, many accused Christians of being cannibals. Pliny decided to make a thorough investigation. He discovered, to his surprise, that the accusation was incorrect. Pliny was no fan of Christians, but in his writings he mentions them as being interrogated, convicted, and even killed for being followers of Christ. These two famous historians leave no doubt as to the origin of the religion and of Jesus Christ. They also serve as historical proof of the Bible.

The Jewish Historian Josephus

Arguably the most famous Jewish historian of the first century was Flavius Josephus. Some say he was the father of modern history. Josephus is best known for two works, “The Jewish War” and “Antiquities of the Jews.” He wrote both of them in Greek, apparently to appeal to educated people. Josephus, according to historians, was the best source of information about first-century Palestine. Jesus is mentioned twice in “Jewish Antiquities,” a massive 20-volume history of the Jewish people that was written around A.D. 93.

Below is the “Testimonium Flavianum” as it appears in virtually all copies of Josephus’s writings:

“Around this time there lived Jesus, a wise man, if indeed one ought to call him a man. For he was one who did surprising deeds, and a teacher of such people as to accept the truth gladly. He won over many Jews and many of the Greeks. He was the Messiah. When Pilate, upon hearing him accused by men of the highest standing among us, had condemned him to be crucified, those who in the first place came to love him did not give up their affection for him, for on the third day, he appeared to them restored to life. The prophets of God had prophesied this and countless other marvelous things about him. And the tribe of Christians, so called after him, have still to this day not died out” (Antiquities of the Jews, 18.3.3 §63)



History Shows Other Notable Characters in the Bible

Is the Bible true? Secular history corroborates the existence of more than 100 biblical characters. Among those 100 characters, below are two Old Testament figures who are easily identified by secular historical sources: Shishak, pharaoh of Egypt, is mentioned in 1 Kings 11:40 and 14:25. There are numerous inscriptions and historical records for this pharaoh. The record of his campaign against Palestine (924 B.C.) is inscribed on the exterior south wall of the temple of Amun at Karnak in Thebes, and it conforms to the biblical account. There is no doubt about its authenticity. Hophra, another pharaoh of Egypt, is mentioned in the New Testament. The New Testament has its own list of historical characters: Tiberius Caesar, Pontius Pilate, Herod, his brother Philip, and Annas and Caiaphas are all mentioned in Luke 3:1-2 in connection with the beginning of John the Baptist’s preaching, which introduced Jesus Christ. The image of Tiberius Caesar (42 B.C. to A.D. 37) is found on numerous Roman coins. Herod the tetrarch of Galilee and his brother Philip, the tetrarch of Iturea, are mentioned by the historian Josephus.

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A stone inscription dedicated to Pontius Pilate reads: "Pontius Pilate, Prefect of Judea." In archaeology, it is called the Pilate Stone and is kept in the Israel Museum. Annas and Caiaphas are both mentioned by Josephus as being among the Jewish high priests of the first century. It doesn't take a long search to see proof that the Bible is historically accurate. HIS STORY (History) speaks for itself.

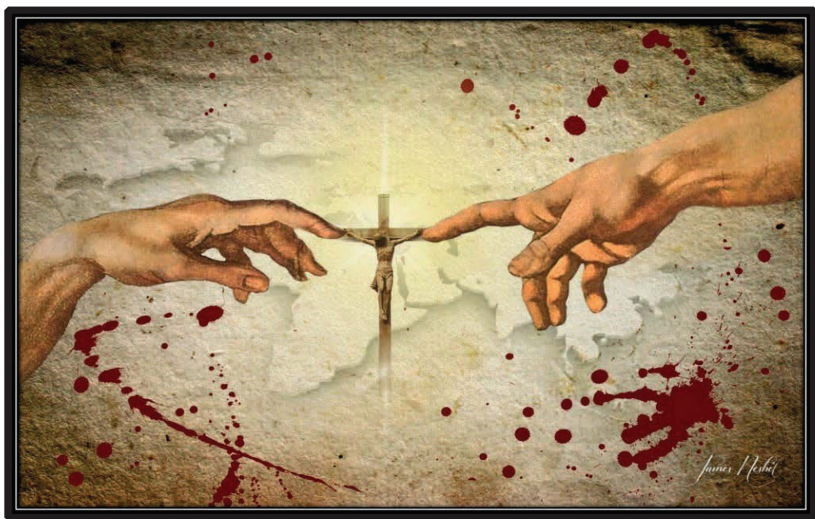

CHAPTER 6

What If Christ Was Never Born?



One of the greatest revolutionary events that has been downplayed by society is how Jesus Christ affected our cultural gateways and every area of life. The impact of Jesus's life—and death—has touched and continues to affect every person on earth.

Entire populations are changed when they realize the value of how God has regarded mankind because of His love for us. God provides a better quality of life with inspiration, security, awareness, and unmatched love—things that the world tries to manufacture but seldom fulfills. Just look around you.

Years ago, a book was published by Dr. D. James Kennedy and Jerry Newcombe called, "What If Jesus Had Never Been Born?" It gives great insight into how and why Christ impacted the world.

Jesus Christ has Impacted Every Area of Life

Christianity brought value to human life and came to the defense of those who needed protection and a voice:

- **Christianity has provided a sanctuary for children.** Through the ages, children have been sacrificed (even up to this day by abortion). Children were once considered property, and infanticide was widespread. They were enslaved in various forms of child labor and had no legal rights.

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Jesus came to define and secure life. Christian principles have become some of the bedrock laws of our land.

- Women were considered property in many ancient cultures and they had no rights. Killing baby girls was common because they were not wanted. Christian missionaries, who traveled the world, changed these abuses on women in most cultures. Feminists claim that Christianity oppressed women, **but it actually set them free.**
- The elderly have also been maligned throughout history. Many cultures had them killed off because they were a burden to society. **Jesus Christ put value on all life**, and the elderly have more respect and are better cared for today.
- Slavery was commonplace throughout the world in ancient times and continues in some places today. The teachings of Christianity set people free because of men like William Wilberforce, who ended the slave trade in England. Have people abused the teachings of Jesus Christ? Most certainly. The fact is, however, **that because of the efforts of Christians worldwide, slavery ended.** The majority of the members of the Abolition Society and Underground Railroad, for example, were Christians.
- Many early emperors made killing a spectacle—a form of entertainment. **The influence of Christianity, which accentuated the value of human life, ended gladiator contests in the Roman Colosseum and the persecution and killing of civilians.** Christians were among the first to embrace “All Lives Matter,” an honorable anthem today.
- In many ancient and primitive societies, cannibalism was very common. Many cultures believed that eating the conquered would give them strength. The modern missions movement and preaching of the Gospel have ended this practice in the majority of the world.
- Human life can be devalued in many ways, suicide being one. People may commit suicide either to escape life’s problems or because they see it as some type of valiant way of leaving this world behind. **Christianity respects life and provides a message of hope, as well as gives people a reason to live.**
- The theory of evolution has attempted to upset God’s divine order of life. The Bible explains that human life is more valuable than animal life. Regardless, the Bible has always been a proponent of animal rights. There are many Bible verses about kindness toward animals. **God’s Word says to treat animals kindly and take care of them.** (Proverbs 12:10).

- **The sanctity of human life is God's highest concern. Christianity has prevented euthanasia from becoming widespread in the world.** In 1994, the Michigan Supreme Court made a significant contribution to the late-20th-century debate over the "right to die" and the right to physician assistance in exercising it. That year, the court upheld a Michigan statute that outlawed assisted suicide, denying that neither Michigan nor the United States could guarantee a right to end one's life.

The primary leader of the physician-assisted suicide movement, Jack Kevorkian, was defeated in his effort to assert death as a constitutional right. He was ultimately convicted of murder and imprisoned.

- Human suffering, poverty, oppression, and physical affliction have always been part of life. The teachings of Jesus Christ centered on helping the poor, unwanted, lonely, and oppressed. There is no other religion or philosophy in the world that focuses on and proclaims a love for our fellow man. **Christianity gives a message of hope, charity, and truth that sets people free.**
- Christianity originated the first orphanages, hospitals, homeless shelters, places to feed the poor, and mission agencies to care for the physically and mentally afflicted. **It is also the most giving institution on earth.**
- Jesus Christ never supported ignorance. The Word of God says that people perish for lack of knowledge and encourages learning and growing in wisdom. **The greatest universities in the world were begun by Christians**, with their foundation being Jesus Christ. Even though some of them have become opponents of the Christian faith, there is no denying these university origins.
- Christian missionaries and organizations, such as the Wycliffe Bible translators, transcribe languages of many obscure cultures. **It's through these Bible translations that people around the world are learning to read and write and become educated.**
- **The Protestant Reformation birthed the idea of education for all.** We have found that nations emphasizing the Word of God have a more educated population.
- The origin of education in America was due to one purpose: **to know and understand the Bible.** The first Congress of the United States passed the Northwest Ordinance in 1787: "Religion, morality, and knowledge, being necessary to good government... should forever be encouraged."

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- A study of American history shows that this nation was based on Christianity. **America would not exist if Jesus Christ had never been born.** The first settlers who came to America in Plymouth, Massachusetts, wrote America's birth certificate, called the Mayflower Compact. The pilgrims who wrote it were part of a separatist movement seeking freedom of religion, so they fled England and other parts of Europe.
- This document stated that **they came to America for the glory of God and the advancement of the Christian faith.** Some secular books have ridiculed the Pilgrims and Puritans. Instead, we need to be grateful for their discoveries and contributions.
- **The Founding Fathers of this nation cited the Bible more than any other work in their speeches and writings.** The vast majority of signers of our Declaration of Independence were Orthodox Evangelical Christians. Other legal scholars and political philosophers, such as Montesquieu, Blackstone, and Locke, quoted the Bible in their works. Our three branches of government are derived from the Old Testament (Isaiah 33:22) and many governing principles are modeled after the New Testament.
- The first act of the first Congress was to hire chaplains to say prayers before the sessions of the House and Senate. They called for national days of fasting, prayer, and thanksgiving. In 1890, the U.S. Supreme Court examined thousands of documents and **declared America to be truly a Christian nation.**
- **The concept of the word freedom has come from the writings of the Bible.** Jesus Christ is the greatest emancipator and declarer of freedom in the world. He set people free from sin, resulting in positive benefits for society.
- The origin of science came about because of the influence of Christianity. **Christianity is the mother of science.** Although the Greeks came up with many interesting facts, they never developed anything like the modern science we have today. Christianity shows that God created the world, that He is rational and logical, and that physical, moral, and spiritual laws exist. The greatest pioneers of science in any field were committed Christians and creationists.
- **The Bible contains many scientific facts within it.** These facts were in the Bible before people had even discovered them. One example is that the Bible called the world a sphere or a circle while many said the earth was flat.

- **Christianity has impacted the economic structures of the world.** It speaks of having a sound work ethic, being a good servant, and conducting business fairly and honestly.
- **The free enterprise system was birthed by Christianity.** John Calvin has been credited as being the founder of capitalism. He said the attainment of wealth should be the resultant fruit of our labors and would be a sign of God's blessing.
- **Family structures and sexual mores and attitudes have been affected by the influence of Christianity.** The traditional family unit and its importance to society have been preserved because of Christianity. Sexual standards have been set to protect mankind from disease, stop perversions, and keep marriages intact. Historically, societies that have veered away from traditional family structures and the sexual standards that God has ordained in His Word have fallen.
- **Christ the Healer has impacted the field of medicine and our health.** Men and women of the Christian faith have stepped forward and made many discoveries in medicine. Along with the attributes of the compassion and mercy of Jesus Christ, great benefits have come to mankind. Hospitals, the Red Cross, preventive medicine, and nursing societies originated because of the influence of Christianity.
- **The Ten Commandments, or the moral code, have set a standard throughout the world that people can live by.** This standard protects the weak and the innocent and brings consequences for wrongful actions. It sets up a deterrent for our sinful nature and character. The idea of selfishness is replaced with the idea of putting the interests of others ahead of our own.
- **Art, music, and literature have also been greatly impacted by the influences of Christianity.** Many great works of art, the building of cathedrals, musical compositions, and writings have been created by inspired people who sought God first.
- **The greatest impact of all is where Jesus Christ came, died, and rose again to take away the sins of the world.** Countless souls have been saved and gone on to eternity, and now share heaven with God. The Gospel's message of hope has been given to the lost and downtrodden of the world. **God is love and He wants to save all people.**

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Above all the forces and movements throughout history, Christianity—with Jesus at its core—has been the dominant influencer for the good of all mankind. Although people do fail and have misrepresented Christianity throughout the ages, **God has not failed any of us.**

CHAPTER 8

Biblical Discrepancies Answered



Are you a skeptic who needs to be shown the facts? Are you a person who'd honestly like to believe the Bible but you're having some problems with it? If you don't want to believe the Bible, ask yourself why. But if you'd sincerely like to believe. This chapter will show you how to solve the most commonly-mentioned Bible "contradictions".

You may find difficult passages in the Bible or see places where it seems to conflict. You will find that in a true examination, what may appear to be an error isn't an error in the Scriptures but an error in understanding. With point-by-point clear explanations, you will be able to see the truth and consistency of the Bible—new insight that breaks doubt and builds faith and knowledge.

Most-Mentioned Discrepancies

Question: What are we to make of the two different accounts of the creation of man in Genesis 1 and 2?

Answer: We need to make sense of them! Let's take a minute to expound, rather than confound them. The first account tells how the universe was formed and filled (Genesis 1:1-2:4). The second account zooms in on how the Garden of Eden was formed and filled (Genesis 2:5-25). Chronologically, the second account overlaps the end of the first account and gives important details about man's origin and status.

The first account ends in Genesis 2:4, which says, "These are the generations of the heavens and the earth when they were created...." That verse is a colophon (or concluding summary) of what had gone before. Further, Genesis 2:5 opens with the word *Vuh*. When a major section of Genesis begins, this word is normally used. *Vuh* can mean "and," but when there is any break in the storyline or a contrast appears, it takes on the sense of "but" or "now." The New American Standard Bible correctly translated this first word of 5:1 as "Now." This contrast is between God's country, which is wild, and man's country—the walled garden, which God lovingly planted, leaving only a little unfinished to give man something to do.

In this account, it is important to note that "earth" means soil rather than planet. The word *eretz* is most often used for limited land areas. By establishing the local, limited scope of this account, we can clear the usual objections to it. The place where things were just starting to grow at this point was the Garden of Eden, not the globe! It's only in the Garden of Eden that snakes didn't crawl, thorns and thistles didn't grow, and plants were watered with mist and rivers instead of rain. This unique place is not to be confused with the rest of the planet. It was the garden of God (Ezekiel 28:13), where He manifested His presence and supernatural influence (Genesis 4:16).

There's one more thing that needs to be clarified. Genesis 2:19 says that God formed the animals and brought them to man so he could name them. But note that it does not say that God formed them at that moment! He selected some of the animals He had formed earlier and brought them to Adam. It's only by assuming that God formed His first animals (and trees) at the same time that we could make this local creation account contradict the universal.

When we observe the scope of the passage and pay attention to what's said—and what's not said—we find it harmonizes well with the earlier creation account. It rounds out its details very nicely. And why wouldn't it? Moses was not so stupid as to contradict himself on the next page!

Question: Where did Cain get his wife? Other than Cain's mother, Eve, no women are named in the story of the first human family. We read only of Adam, Eve, Cain, and his dead brother, Abel.

Answer: This was explained most eloquently by R.A. Torrey, a noted biblical historian:

"Where did Cain get his wife? This seems to be a favorite question with skeptics. I have also met young Christians who have been greatly puzzled and perplexed over this question. But if one studies the Bible carefully and notes exactly what it says, there is really no great difficulty in the question. Unbelievers assert that the Bible says that 'Cain went into the land of Nod and took to himself a wife.' In fact, it says nothing of the kind.

What the Bible does say is that 'Cain went out from the presence of the Lord, and dwelt in the land of Nod, on the east of Eden. And Cain knew his wife; and she conceived, and bore Enoch'

(Genesis 4:16-17). What the Bible means by "knew" in this connotation does not mean to get acquainted with but is connected with the procreation of species (see Genesis 4:1, Judges 11:39, 1 Samuel 1:19 and Matthew 1:25). Cain had his wife before going to the land of Nod (and certainly before murdering Abel) and took her there with him.

But who was she, and where did he get her? In Genesis 5:3-4 we learn that Adam, in his long life of 930 years, had many sons and daughters. There's little doubt that Cain married one of those numerous daughters. But someone could say, "In that case, Cain married his own sister!" Yes, that was a necessity. If the whole Adamic race was to descend from a single pair, the sons and daughters must intermarry. But as the race increased, it was no longer necessary for men to marry their sisters, and the practice, if continued, would result in great mischief to the race. Indeed, even the intermarriage of cousins in the present day can bring frightful consequences. But in the dawn of human history, such intermarriage was not surrounded by these dangers. God had created Adam genetically perfect (Genesis 1:27).

As late as the time of Abraham, that patriarch married his halfsister (Genesis 20:12). But as the race multiplied and such intermarriages became unnecessary—as they were accompanied by great dangers—God forbade the marriage of brother and sister (Leviticus 18:6), and such marriage would now be a sin because of the commandment of God. It was not sin in the dawn of the race when the only male and female inhabitants of the earth were brothers and sisters. Such marriage today is a crime, the crime of incest, and we cannot carry back the conditions of today into the time of the dawn of human history and judge those actions performed." —R.A. Torrey, "Difficulties and Alleged Errors and Contradictions in the Bible"

To sum it up, Cain married one of the many daughters of Adam and Eve. The original gene pool was perfect; therefore, imperfect births due to intermarriage did not occur.

Question: How many pairs of each animal did Noah take into the ark? Was it one pair (Genesis 6:19), or seven pairs (Genesis 7:2)?

Answer: Noah brought in exactly what God commanded—one pair of each ordinary animal—and then six more pairs of any animals that were suitable for a blood sacrifice (Genesis 7:2). He was told the reason for bringing in the male and female pairs was to prevent their extinction (Genesis 6:19b). The additional pairs of “clean” animals were for Noah to offer as sacrifices to God (Genesis 8:20). It’s easy to see that if Noah had sacrificed his only male or female of a species, he would have caused their extinction.

One skeptic argued that after God had commanded Noah to load seven pairs of the clean animals, Noah disobeyed, and brought in only two of every kind (Genesis 7:9). But this critic is mistaken. Genesis 7:9 does not say Noah brought in two of each animal. It says he brought in the animals “by twos” (plural). He brought in one pair of each unclean animal and seven pairs of each clean animal. But all of them were paired, weren’t they? (After all, taking along an equal number of males and females should have made their mating somewhat easier!) That Noah brought in the species by pairs is evident, not only in the original Hebrew but also in every English translation.

Question: How can it be fair for God to forgive some people for their major sins (David, Paul), while killing others for their tiny mistakes (Lot’s wife, Uzza, Ananias and Sapphira)?

Answer: The problem is strictly one of perspective. Neither one of these actions is a stretch for God. These actions only appear extreme to us, because unlike God, we are finite, imperfect beings. As such, we may find it nearly impossible to identify with the actions of an infinite and perfect being. We might attempt to re-create Him in our imperfect image, or try to measure his infinite justice with our own yardstick. But it doesn’t work. What we may feel is impossible (forgiving a murderer, perhaps) is quite easy for God, who is love personified. What we may feel is easy (say, letting an obstinate liar reside in heaven) is fully impossible for God, who is so utterly holy that He cannot approve the least wrongdoing.

To be specific, God’s misunderstood “extreme” behavior is fair because God is both infinitely merciful and infinitely holy. Because God’s mercy is infinite, He has promised to always forgive anyone who sincerely repents, no matter how terrible their sin. That’s just what we expect from an infinitely merciful being, isn’t it?

He has promised He will never forgive those who refuse to repent, no matter how small their sin seems. And that’s consistent with what we would expect of an infinitely holy being.

This extreme, hyper-dimensional, infinite holiness of God may pose a serious threat to you and me. And His mercy may seem a little much at times. But then, reality does not always conform to the way we wish it to be, does it? Neither will our Maker.

Anyone who takes a science class quickly finds that nature is under no obligation to limit herself to what we're presently able to comprehend. The universe itself does not bother to operate on our current intellectual level, so why should its Maker? If a perfect being chose to become less than perfect, that would be extremely foolish. And a being that foolish would never have been perfect in the first place. That scenario would result in a contradiction. A Supreme Being can only will what is wise. To will foolishness would be a sign of weakness, not a display of omnipotence.

God is a wise, perfect Being. So, what isn't fair, then, is that you blame Him for being who He is! What's He really supposed to do, anyway—become imperfect for our convenience? When He came to this earth in the person of His Son, and died a criminal's death on our behalf, that was just as low as He could reach toward us without ceasing to be God. He's not now going to condemn the repentant or forgive the unrepentant, just to meet your minute expectations or merit your approval!

In short, God is infinitely merciful and infinitely holy, and there's nothing anyone can do to change this—not even God.

Question: How did Judas die? Was it by hanging himself (Matthew 27:5) or by falling on rocks and bursting open (Acts 1:18)?

Answer: Both are fully true. As Geisler and Howe (biblical scholars) state, "These accounts are not contradictory but mutually complementary. Judas hung himself exactly as Matthew affirms that he did. The account in Acts simply adds that Judas fell, and his body opened up in the middle and his intestines gushed out. This is the very thing one would expect of someone who hanged himself from a tree over a cliff and fell on sharp rocks below."

Biblical scholar Gleason Archer adds more, "Acts 1:18 goes on to state: 'And he, falling headlong, burst asunder, and all of his inwards gushed out.' This indicates that the tree from which Judas suspended himself overhung a precipice. If the branch from which he had hung himself was dead and dry—and many trees match this description even to this day on the brink of the canyon that tradition identifies as the place where Judas died—it would take only one strong gust of wind to yank the heavy corpse and split the branch to which it was attached, plunging both with great force into the bottom of the chasm below.

There is indication that a strong wind arose at the hour Christ died, tearing the great curtain inside the temple from top to bottom (Matthew 27:51). This was accompanied by a rock-splitting earthquake and undoubtedly also by a thunderstorm, which normally follows a prolonged

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period of cloud gathering and darkness (Matthew 27:45). Conditions were right for what had started as a mere suicide by hanging to turn into a grisly mutilation of the corpse as the branch gave way to the force of the wind and was hurtled down to the bottom.”

—Encyclopedia of Bible Difficulties

And, biblical scholar John Haley reconciles the passages as follows:

“Neither of these statements excludes the other. Matthew does not deny that Judas, after hanging himself, fell and burst asunder; Peter does not assert that Judas did not hang himself previous to his fall. Probably the circumstances were much as follows: Judas suspended himself from a tree on the brink of the precipice overhanging the valley of Hinnom, and the limb or the rope giving way, he fell, and was mangled as described in Acts.

Professor of Biblical Literature Horatio Hackett, who recently visited the supposed scene of this tragic event, deems the above explanation “entirely natural.” As he stood in the valley and looked up to the rocky terraces that hung over it, which he found by measurement to vary from 25 to 40 feet and almost perpendicular in height, he felt “more than ever satisfied” with the solution just given. He speaks of trees still growing upon the margin of these precipices, and of a rocky pavement at the bottom of the ledges, upon which the traitor would be crushed and mangled, as well as killed, in his fall. The professor suggests that Judas may have struck upon some pointed rock, which entered his body and caused his bowels to gush out.

We do not know how long Judas remained suspended, nor how far decomposition was advanced when he fell. So, in this case, Matthew gives one aspect of the affair, and Peter another, yet there is no contradiction between them.”

How to Handle any Bible Difficulty

Whenever you encounter another so-called “mistake” or “contradiction” in the Bible, face it squarely and sincerely. R.A. Torrey, who was himself a skeptic for many years, suggests we should deal with the difficulties of the Bible honestly, humbly, determinedly, fearlessly, patiently, scripturally, and prayerfully.

Another approach is hermeneutics. That’s the science of interpreting literature. It helps you find out what a writer meant, instead of reading your own ideas into a work. This website is a great resource to handle any Bible difficulty - <https://defendinginerrancy.com/bible-difficulties/>

TEN SOUND RULES FOR BIBLE INTERPRETATION

1. Do not assume that what is not explained cannot be explained. It's likely that someone before you has already solved your difficulty.
2. Consider the Bible innocent until proven guilty. We don't generally assume the newspaper is lying until we can evaluate each statement. The Bible is entitled to the benefit of the doubt.
3. Do not confuse your interpretation of the Bible with the Bible itself.
4. Pay close attention to the context. What is being said? To whom? Under what circumstances, and for what reason?
5. Interpret difficult passages in the light of clear ones.
6. Remember that the Bible was written in human language and often expresses human perspectives, thought patterns, emotions, and interests.
7. Do not assume that a partial report is a false report.
8. Do not demand word-for-word quotations of the Old Testament by New Testament writers. People in ancient times did not quote as we do today.
9. Do not assume that varying accounts are false ones. If you examine them, you will find that they are complementary rather than contradictory.
10. Remember that there are minor variations in our handwritten copies. It is the original scrolls that are without error, not the copies.

Common Questions Regarding the Bible

1. “How do you know the Bible is true?” It’s a book written by men.” The Bible is the one true Word of God and is written by God-inspired men. *“All Scripture is given by the inspiration of God and is profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for instruction in righteousness: that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work”* (2 Timothy 3:16-17).

One translation says, *“God has transmitted His very substance into every Scripture, for it is God-breathed. It will empower you by its instruction and correction, giving you the strength to take the right direction and lead you deeper into the path of godliness.”* God-hearing, inspired individuals wrote the books of the Bible as they were moved by the Holy Spirit (2 Peter 1:21). *“But there is a spirit in man: and the inspiration of the Almighty gives them understanding”* (Job 32:8).

The Bible was written by 40 different authors—kings, peasants, fishermen, philosophers, poets, scholars, statesmen, herdsmen, a tax collector, a doctor, a military general, a rabbi, and a prime minister—over a period of 1,500 years, encompassing 40 generations. It was written on three continents in three different languages. From Genesis, the first book, to Revelation, the last book, you will see the Bible is

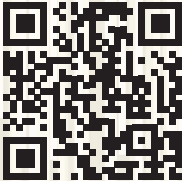
intricately connected and self-supporting. The Scriptures proclaim and prove God's design and source of truth. The Bible has survived time, persecution, and criticism. Its power will continue until the end of time. "Heaven and earth shall pass away, but My Words shall not pass away" (Matthew 24:35). Voltaire, a noted French philosopher, once stated that in 100 years from his time, Christianity would be swept from existence and passed into history. But what happened? Only 50 years after his death, the Geneva Bible Society used his press and house to produce stacks of Bibles.

Believing the Word of God requires an individual to make a choice, using faith, to agree that the Word is indeed true and inspired (Matthew 7:7-11; Proverbs 1:24-33, 2:1-5). *"But without faith, it is impossible to please Him"* (Hebrews 11:6).

Open the Bible, thoughtfully read it, and ask God for understanding. God is faithful and will show you that His Word is true and written by the inspiration of the Creator of the universe. *"Faith comes by hearing and hearing by the Word of God"* (Romans 10:17).

2. “Why are there so many contradictions in the Bible?”

There are none! What initially appears to be a contradiction usually results from taking things out of context. More importantly, they come from not having all of the information on the subject matter. All perceived contradictions have been proven not to be contradictions at all. Recent archaeological discoveries have cleared up the majority of them. Skeptics will try to discredit God, but His Word remains infallible! A mind biased against the will of God will often jump to perceived contradictions to justify their disbelief. People need to know there is an answer to every one of those supposed contradictions.

3. “How did the Old Testament come about? Is it accurate and relevant?”

The accuracy of the Old Testament text has been demonstrated by the discovery of the Dead Sea Scrolls in 1947. They date from the first two centuries B.C through the first century A.D. Before that, the oldest Hebrew manuscripts were dated no earlier than the end of the ninth century. The oldest complete Hebrew Bible is from about one century later. With the discovery of the Dead Sea documents, our history of the Old Testament was pushed back approximately 100 years!

These scrolls have provided monumental evidence of the precision and accuracy of the Old Testament. Note, for example, Gleason Archer's comment about the accuracy of the Masoretic Text (the 24 books of the Hebrew Bible) as compared with the Isaiah scrolls of the Dead Sea: *“Even though the two copies of Isaiah discovered in Qumran Cave 1 near the Dead Sea in 1947 were 100 years earlier than the oldest-dated manuscript previously known (A.D. 980), they proved to be word-for-word identical to our standard Hebrew Bible in more than 95% of the text. The 5% variation consisted chiefly of obvious slips of the pen and variations in spelling.”*

God preserves His Word! *“The words of the Lord are pure words, like silver refined in a furnace of earth, purified seven times. You shall keep them O Lord, You shall preserve them from this generation forever”* (Psalm 12:6-7).

4. “Can we rely on the New Testament because it has been copied so many times?”

Many people are surprised when they first learn that we possess none of the original documents of the New Testament. The loss of these documents is undoubtedly by Divine design because if they were preserved, people may have made idols of them rather than being directed to God. Despite the absence of these originals, however, thanks to the work of archaeologists and textual critics, the New Testament is a reliable text.

The original text of the New Testament is derived from three general sources: Greek manuscripts, ancient versions of the New Testament, and quotations from the New Testament in the writings of the early church fathers (from the post-apostolic age).

The most accurate manuscripts representing the New Testament are usually some of the ones from which the Textus Receptus (Received Text) was taken. They consist of the majority of Greek manuscripts that agree with each other and have been accepted by Bible-believing Christians through the centuries. This was the text that the Protestants of the Reformation knew to be the Word of God—inerrant and infallible.

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Two other manuscripts, Codex Vaticanus (A.D. 325) and Codex Sinaiticus (A.D. 350), date within 250 years of the time of their composition. This may seem like a long span, but it is minimal when compared to most major works. Take Caesar's "The Gallic Wars," for example. The earliest copy dates back 1,000 years after the original. The first complete copy of Homer's "Odyssey" was found 2,200 years after it was originally written. When the intervals between the writings of the New Testament and its earliest copies are compared to other ancient works, the New Testament intervals prove to be much closer than the original!

In addition, we have over 10,000 translations of the New Testament in ancient languages, some reaching back to the second and third centuries. Again, God preserves His Word. *"Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will not pass away"* (Matthew 24:35).

5. “What about all the other religions and beliefs that say they are right?”

There is only one path to the Almighty God. *“For there is one God, and one Mediator between God and men, the Man Christ Jesus”* (1 Timothy 2:5). There is only one truth. *“Jesus said unto him, I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life: No man comes unto the Father but through Me”* (John 14:6).

A person can only be saved and reconciled to God because of the birth, life, burial, and resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ. *“Nor is their salvation in any other, for there is no other name under heaven given among men, by which we must be saved”* (Acts 4:12). Jesus sacrificed Himself to take away our sins. Only He can remove our sins and only in this miraculous way.

All but four of the major world religions are based on mere philosophical presumptions. *“Beware that no one distracts you or intimidates you in their attempt to lead you away from Christ’s fullness by pretending to be full of wisdom when they’re filled with endless arguments of human logic”* (Colossians 2:8). Of the four world religions that are based on personalities rather than a philosophical system, only Christianity claims an empty tomb— **the resurrection of Christ from the dead**—as its foundation. (Matthew 27:62-66 and Chapter 28.)

The shed blood of Jesus Christ on the cross is the only sacrifice that can take away the sins of the world. There are not many paths or ways to God as some profess today. All people have sinned and broken God’s laws (Ten Commandments), and God created a perfect sacrifice to atone for our sins. He offers Jesus Christ, the only provision for a lost and dying world. *“Whoever calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved”* (Romans 10:13).

Either Christ is a liar or He is the Truth. You must thoughtfully decide. God has given each of us free will to choose, but the evidence is strong. Who is Jesus Christ to you? This is the most important question you will ever answer.

Many people call themselves good, but by whose and what standard? *“There is a way that seems right to a person, but the ends are the ways of death”* (Proverbs 14:12).

The Bible says that everyone has broken God’s moral absolutes. *“All have sinned and come short of the glory of God”* (Romans 3:23). We all have broken His commandments.

“Wherefore the law was our schoolmaster to bring us unto Christ, that we might be justified by faith. But after that faith comes, we are no longer under a schoolmaster. For ye are all the children of God by faith in Christ Jesus.” (Galatians 3: 24-26)

For example, have you ever lied, stolen, cheated, or lusted? We deserve His justice, but instead, He offers mercy and grace! He shows us His love by clearly warning us about His judgment for disobedience. *“In flaming fire taking vengeance on those who do not know God and on those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ: They will suffer the punishment of everlasting destruction, away from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of His power”* (2 Thessalonians 1:8-9).

Know this: A person without holiness will not see God (Hebrews 12:14). Good news! God makes provision for all to be saved (Romans 2:11) because He does not want anyone to perish (2 Peter 3:9). He has set down a plan for mankind to respond to Him or face His judgment (Romans 1:18-32 and 2:1-16). *“And as it is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment”* (Hebrews 9:27). People choose to rebel, but God does everything He can to prevent it by offering His love. You have free will (Romans 10:13) and without it, no true love can exist. God has no pleasure in the death of the wicked (Ezekiel 18:23). Hell shows the seriousness of breaking God’s laws and how He values His children who keep them. Probably the most popular New Testament passage summarizes His message of salvation:

“For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved” (John 3:16-17).

God loves and desires the best for you. Never forget His warnings are an act of love. Choose the saving knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ.

7. “How can an individual in a third world country who has never heard about the Bible or Jesus be condemned?”

God is not a respecter of persons nor wants any to perish (Romans 2:11, 2 Peter 3:9). People will perish if they do not follow Christ. “And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven that has been given among men by which we must be saved” (Acts 4:12). If any person wants to know the true God, he will hear the Gospel by some means, as you have. God made all things and knows every hair on your head (Luke 12:7). He searches the whole earth for those who will serve Him with a sincere heart (Jeremiah 23:24). Could anyone find Christ who truly wants to know Him? Yes!

God has also given us the creation to show that there is intelligence behind the grand design we witness daily. Is there a builder for a building or a painter for a painting? So how much more is there a Creator for the 40 million nerve endings in one eyeball alone? God has created all things—from invisible qualities to majestic landscapes—and He said because of creation “*people are without excuse*” (Romans 1:20). All people are equally accountable before God.

We all have been given a measure of faith (Romans 12:3). We have the innate ability to believe in something. It may be in the one true God, a false god, or no god (atheism).

We are made in God's image (Genesis 1:26) as we have a mind to think, reason, and imagine. “Come now, let us reason together, says the Lord....” (Isaiah 1:18). People can understand the difference between right and wrong as God has put His moral law in each heart (Romans 2:14-15). The Godgiven conscience we have approves or condemns our actions and thoughts.

All people around the world are created to seek God. Cultural influences and pressures certainly have a great effect on a person's beliefs. But there isn't any power to stop God from reaching any person (John 17:2, 19:11; Acts 26:15-18). “*For with God nothing is impossible*” (Luke 1:37). The Gospel has gone out to the ends of the known world (Acts 2:5; Romans 1:8, 10:18, 16:26; Colossians 1:6, 23). God is continually searching the ends of the earth for those who will acknowledge and

seek Him (Psalm 98:2-3; Isaiah 51:4-8; 2 Chronicles 16:9; Psalm 11:3-7, 34:11-22).

There is one true God who has laid down a plan of salvation for all. There are not many ways to God—but only one—through Jesus Christ (John 14:6, Acts 4:12). All people have sinned and broken God's moral laws, and Jesus shed His blood as an atoning sacrifice for all those who believe in Him.

God can send a missionary, an angel, a message in a dream or vision—and this booklet to you. He is a creative, limitless God who reaches inquiring souls anywhere in the world. With God nothing is impossible (Luke 1:37). But the unfortunate truth is that most will reject His call (Matthew 7:13). Many say they want to know but are not willing to pay the price or seek the truth. God is responsible for reaching any who desires to know Him. God is love and does not want anyone to perish (2 Peter 3:8-9).

8. “If God is so loving, how could He destroy all of those people in the Old Testament, including women and children?”

It's precisely because He is a good God that He ordered their extermination. God wasn't merely thinking of the present, as man does. He was wisely determining the future course of our human race. Moreover, God's war was not merciless and unlimited, as some critics have slanderously suggested. These people were spared for as long as they could be, and only when it was clear that they would not change, God ordered their destruction. Even then, as many people as could safely be spared were allowed to live.

Further, total destruction was limited to some cities in Canaan, not all. It was not genocide or racial cleansing, as some carelessly claim. And this was not to be an ongoing policy for all time. It was never issued to anyone except the generation of Joshua.

The Scriptures affirm that God is morally perfect. He is holy (Isaiah 6:3, Revelation 4:8), just and righteous (Psalm 89:14), and good (Psalm 100:6, 106:1). Given this, some could be puzzled at certain commands that God gave in the Old Testament. When the Israelites were commissioned to take the land of Canaan, the Lord instructed them to completely smite the people and to show no mercy to them (Deuteronomy 7:1-5). And when Israel invaded Jericho, the same. “And they utterly destroyed all that was in the city, both man and woman, both young and old, and ox, and sheep, and ass, with the edge of the sword” (Joshua 6:21). When looking at this passage we must consider some things.

God was very patient with these grossly immoral pagan tribes for a very long time. When Abraham first came into the land of Canaan, the Lord promised that this country would someday belong to His seed, but it could not yet be theirs for “the iniquity of the Amorite is not yet full,”

declared God (Genesis 15:16). It was as though the sins of those heathen people were gradually filling up a container; finally, a point was reached on the Lord's moral barometer that He could no longer tolerate. They had to be destroyed. It was not a violation of His goodness; rather, it was to preserve it. **It makes me wonder about America today. Do we deserve mercy or judgment?**

Baal, the Semitic god of life, caused fertility to be worshipped by many ancient middle eastern communities—especially the Canaanites. They had absolutely no concept of morality. Baal is represented as practicing vile sex acts and influencing others to do likewise. In the Canaanite religion, homosexuals and prostitutes were employed to raise money for the support of the temples. It is not an exaggeration to say that these pagans elevated sex to the status of a god. Sounds almost like today, doesn't it?

The Canaanite religion was a horribly brutal system as well. For instance, the goddess Anath was pictured killing humans by the thousands and wading thigh-high in blood. She cut off heads and hands and wore them as ornaments. The morally depraved Canaanites also sacrificed their own babies to these heathen gods. Funerary jars have been found with the bodies of young children distorted by suffocation as they struggled for life after having been buried alive as sacrifices to Canaanite gods. Such young children have been found in the foundation pillars of Canaanite houses. Sometimes religious ceremonies were associated with their sacrifice.

It's important to realize that destroying these wicked people was for the moral preservation of the nation of Israel. When they invaded Canaan, the Hebrews were not to allow enemies to live so their abominations could not be taught to their current generation. Because the salvation of mankind was at stake, the extermination of the wicked inhabitants of Canaan was an example of moral surgery to eliminate their pagan practices. Children were victims because of the evil of their parents. Given eternal judgment, God treated these children fairer than if they were allowed to live. We have a difficult time understanding this, but God does not want any to perish. And with His warnings, He gives us the grace to obey.

The Canaanites were orgiastic and grossly immoral—even sacrificing their own children to their gods. God had given them 400 years to change their ways, but they had not (Genesis 15:16). After their annihilation, God eliminated the diseases associated with their sin (Numbers 31:19-24) and destroyed every trace of their evil religion to keep it from spreading any further. If He hadn't done so, we would still consider orgies and child sacrifice normal today.

As a result of their destruction, God prevented the women from leading more men astray with their ceremonial prostitution (Numbers 25:1-2). God also prevented the children from avenging their guilty fathers and

from following in the evil ways of their parents. God sent the children to heaven due to a lack of moral accountability, rather than letting them become idolaters who would go to hell. God showed the Israelites (and ourselves) the consequences of sin, however God established a holy nation—the only kind through which He could bless the world.

There were many evil cultures God needed to address.

9. “Why does God allow evil and suffering to occur in the world?”

God does allow evil and suffering to take place. They come as a result of man’s disobedience to His Word, and God is not to blame (Romans 1:21-32). Read Deuteronomy 28 (Book of Consequences) very carefully, and you will see how God considers right and wrong actions and choices.

When God’s standards are broken, man or nation always receives the resulting judgments and consequences. “He who sows iniquity will reap sorrow” (Proverbs 22:8a). We have free will to obey or disobey, and according to our choices, we will receive blessings or curses.

Consider this verse: “I call heaven and earth to record this day against you, that I have set before you life and death, blessing and cursing: therefore choose life, that both you and your seed shall live” (Deuteronomy 30:19). So, sin or rebellion against God’s moral law is the root cause of problems. We should not blame God for the loss of a loved one or sickness and disease. When we continue to break God’s spiritual, physical, and natural laws, we pay a price. But God does care and has set up a plan of lifelong blessings:

- Jesus Christ gave His life for you so you can be saved, healed, and restored (Romans 5:8-10).
- God has promised those who love Him to take care of them (Matthew 6:25-34).
- God desires no one to perish but that all should come to His saving grace (Ephesians 2:8-9).
- God is our shelter and can take any evil and turn all the surrounding circumstances into good for those who trust Him (Romans 8:28).

12. Who are the Nephilim of Genesis 6?

Archeologist, scientist, biblical scholars, researchers, and even some government official have been bringing up the term Nephilim. The word canon, in classical Greek, means straight rod or ruler and refers to any officially recognized collection of authoritative writings for a religion or group. To be included in the Canon of Scripture, a book has to fit into certain parameters set by early church leaders.

This question needs much thought as there are definite pros and cons. Is this technological tool good or evil? In a world increasingly driven by Artificial Intelligence (AI), it is crucial for individuals to ask questions and become aware of how artificial intelligence impacts our lives. We must engage AI with understanding, wisdom, and discernment.

Can AI become human-like leading to an apocalypse? Many have seen movies such as the Terminator series, I Robot and the Matrix. Are these movies a prelude of what is to come? It is no longer science fiction. What happens if an evil entity uses it? We are in the early stages of AI. It is important for us to understand artificial intelligence because it significantly influences culture, ethics, and even theology. If spirits can influence humans (as the Bible clearly teaches), it's not unreasonable to imagine they could influence the systems humans build—especially those that interface with human emotion, behavior, and belief.

- In the Bible, spirits speak through people, manipulate thoughts, and possess bodies.
- AI doesn't have a soul—but it has a mouth, and increasingly, becoming a trusted one.

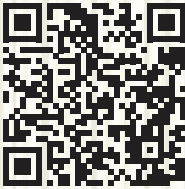

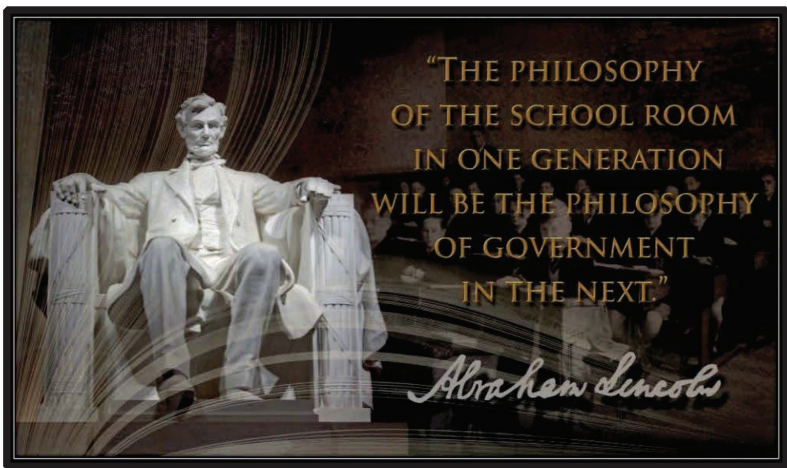

CHAPTER 11

Marxism Impacts A Culture



POINT TO PONDER: “The greatest advantage an enemy can have over you is to make you believe he does not exist.”

—Sun Tzu, Art of War

How did we get to the place where so many doubt the Bible is true, or where people question whether God even exists? Why have so many become atheists, agnostics, and indifferent toward God in our culture? Have we become victims or are we willfully ignorant?

It is said that those who do not study history are doomed to repeat it.

Many who study history say it's indoctrination that has polluted our cultures. Marxism and communism are at the heart of the matter. These are atheistic philosophies with no room for belief in God. Karl Marx, the founder of Marxism, viewed religion as the “opium of the people.” Marx admitted, “My object in life is to dethrone God and destroy capitalism.” He added, “The first requisite for the happiness of the people is the abolition of religion.”

It is a historical fact that wherever Marxists seized power, Christians were always persecuted and atheism was enforced. The Marxist redefines good and evil. So, wickedness is changed from rebellion against God into striving for individual ends. They say utopia (representing Heaven) is ultimately created on earth by man. The collectivist state becomes a god.

The slogans of Lenin (Russia), Khrushchev (Russia), Castro (Cuba), Hitler (Nazi Germany), Mao Tse Tung (China), and other dictators used indoctrination with propaganda on the youth, inciting them to turn on their

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parents and neighbors. Their goal was to train the youth to reject God, become morally perverse, and elect socialists. This is still happening today.

According to Gallup polls in 2021, 40% of the U.S. population views socialism as favorable. Remember that the goal of “isms” (like progressivism, globalism, socialism, fascism, or collectivism) is Marxism/communism. It is whereby the state (government) controls every aspect of human life. The Bible is in direct opposition to this ideology.

Where we’ve seen this movement infiltrate mostly is in K-12 public education. But don’t be fooled—this ideology is throughout universities as well. Look around you. By integrating the media and entertainment, including Hollywood, incremental change and pressure are continual. Weapons are no longer necessary. Winning the hearts and minds of society is the Marxist game plan.

How do you fool millions of people? YOU LIE. And start with the young. If you keep telling people that $1 + 1 = 3$, they will begin to believe it. And sadly, a sustained assault on the Bible has borne bad fruit.

“Give me just one generation of youth, and I’ll transform the whole world.” —Vladimir Lenin

“Give me four years to teach the children, and the seed I have sown will never be uprooted.” —Vladimir Lenin

“The philosophy of the school room in one generation will be the philosophy of government in the next.” —Abraham Lincoln

POINT TO PONDER: Is it possible that our educational institutions have become so corrupt that university campuses are echo chambers? Many students only hear one side of an issue. Most educational institutions have become indoctrination mills—social justice factories—where a slow process over generations has produced a Marxist ideology.

The Bible clearly opposes atheistic Marxist/communist beliefs. It teaches that God redeemed all people from sin by offering His only Son to carry the penalty of their sins (John 3:16). And it addresses social ideology: it teaches that redistributing private property for political purposes is immoral because it undermines accountability and individual freedom, given by the Creator to His children.

Marxism has never been successful. The answers to the world’s problems are found in God’s Word. Atheism, power, control, and laziness have experimentally failed in history to mend the human race’s problems.

Another basic tenet of Marxism, taught by many college professors, is the idea that private property must be abolished. With Marxism, landowners

see their property confiscated by the state, and most private ownership is outlawed. In abolishing private property, Marxism directly contradicts several biblical principles. **The Bible refers to private property and issues commands to respect it:** Injunctions such as “*You shall not steal*” (Deuteronomy 5:19) are meaningless without private property.

The Bible honors work and teaches that individuals are responsible for supporting themselves: “*The one who is unwilling to work shall not eat*” (2 Thessalonians 3:10). The redistribution of wealth mandated by Marxism/communism destroys accountability and the biblical work ethic. Jesus’s parable in Matthew 25:14-30 teaches our responsibility to serve God with our (private) resources. There is no way to reconcile Marxism with the parable of the talents.

Some people attempt to combine Christianity with Marxist philosophy. Their attempts may be well-meaning but they are impractical. The Puritans in the New World, for example, tried communal living for a while but it didn’t last. When the Plymouth Colony was founded, there was no private property, and all food was distributed equally among all, regardless of the job—or work ethic. But that system, lacking any incentive to work hard, was soon abandoned as a complete failure.

Free enterprise brings the most successful and fruitful way of life.

Attempting to combine Christianity with Marxism also ignores their widely divergent views on sin, God, equality, responsibility, and the value of human life. Of course, some people point to Acts 2:44-45 as proof that Christianity is compatible with Marxism or communism: “*All the believers were together and had everything in common. They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need.*”

This passage, as with much of the Book of Acts, is descriptive, not prescriptive—it contains no command for the church to function this way; it is simply a description of what the early church in Jerusalem did to meet some unique and urgent needs. There’s no indication that such extensive sharing was ever copied by other New Testament churches. Also, the communal arrangements in Acts were completely voluntary and motivated by the love of Christ. Any attempt to apply this to involuntary, secular (godless) communism really makes no sense.

The Bible promotes freedom and personal responsibility, and neither of those concepts lasts long under Marxism and Communism. There’s a reason why in Marxist states such as communist China, Cuba, Vietnam, North Korea, Soviet Union and even some European nations today - Christians are persecuted. The ideas espoused by Marxism are antithetical to the teachings of Jesus Christ. The differences are irreconcilable. Let’s define our terms.

Marx argued that all history was a history of class struggle and that the working class (or proletariat) would inevitably triumph over the capital class (bourgeoisie) and win control over the means of production, ultimately eliminating all social classes. Communism, sometimes

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referred to as revolutionary socialism, also originated as a reaction to the Industrial Revolution, and came to be defined by Marx's theories—taken to their extreme. In fact, Marxists often refer to socialism as the first, necessary phase on the way from capitalism to communism. Marx and Engels themselves didn't consistently or clearly differentiate communism from socialism, which helped ensure lasting confusion between the two terms.

Under communism, there is no such thing as private property. All property is communally owned, and each person receives a portion based on need. In practice, a strong central government—the state—controls all aspects of economic production and provides citizens with their basic necessities, including food, housing, medical care and education.

By contrast, under socialism, individuals can still own property. But industrial production, or the chief means of generating wealth, is communally owned and managed by a democratically elected government. Another key difference between socialism and communism is the means of achieving them. In communism, a violent revolution in which the workers rise up against the ruling classes is seen as an inevitable part of achieving a pure communist state. Socialism (deceptively) is a less rigid, more flexible ideology. Its adherents seek change and reform but often insist on making these changes through democratic processes within the existing social and political structure, rather than overthrowing it. If the democratic process does not obtain its end they will resort to violence. So those who call themselves social democrats are really communist in heart and they use “doublespeak” to fool the populace.

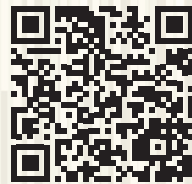

CHAPTER 12

What is a Worldview?



What is a Worldview?

A worldview is the framework from which we view reality and make sense of life and the world. It is any ideology, philosophy, theology, movement, or religion that provides an overarching approach to understanding God, the world, and our relations to God and the world. The term worldview refers to someone's set of answers to all of life's big questions. This could include assessing whether there is a God, what ethical duty human beings have to each other, or how we can know certain things to be true. The concept derives from the German word *weltanschauung*, meaning "a particular philosophy of life."

For example, a two-year-old believes he's the center of his world, a secular humanist believes that the material world is all that exists, and a Buddhist believes he can be liberated from suffering by self-purification. Someone with a biblical worldview believes his primary reason for existence is to love and serve God. Whether consciously or subconsciously, every person has some type of worldview.

A personal worldview is a combination of all you believe to be true. What you believe becomes the driving force behind every emotion, decision, and action. Therefore, it affects your responses to every area of life,

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including philosophy, science, theology, anthropology, economics, law, politics, art, and social order—everything.

Let's suppose you think that beauty is in the eye of the beholder (secular relative truth) instead of beauty as being defined by God's purity and creativity (absolute truth). Then any art piece, no matter how vulgar or abstract, could be considered a creation of beauty. Four Worldview Examples – Which one do you ascribe to?

1. A humanist worldview: A person's worldview might be humanist if they prioritize the importance of human beings solving the big questions of existence for themselves. This stands in contrast to more religious viewpoints, in which people hold closely to what they consider divine or enlightened answers to these questions from deities or inspired teachers.

2. A naturalistic worldview: Some people believe the world is totally explainable through purely natural means. Naturalists often take a stance of skepticism or outright agnosticism when it comes to any claims of the supernatural or divine.

3. A postmodern worldview: When someone holds to a postmodern viewpoint, they likely consider the concept of worldview to be totally subjective. In other words, it's difficult to ground their point of view in anything beyond personal preference. This view renders all beliefs and precepts to be equally valid.

4. A religious worldview: People of faith base their worldviews around the values and dogmas espoused in their sacred texts. For instance, if you choose to embrace a Christian worldview, you would then base your philosophical assessments of reality and ethical beliefs on the teachings and ministry of Jesus Christ. People of faith often turn to apologetics (or arguments in favor of their beliefs) to justify their worldview.

A biblical worldview is based on the infallible Word of God. When you believe the Bible is entirely true, then you allow it to be the foundation of everything you say and do. That means, for instance, you take seriously the mandate in Romans 13 to honor the governing authorities by researching candidates and issues, making voting a priority.

Do you have a biblical worldview? Answer the following questions, based on claims found in the Bible (and which Barna used in his survey):

- Do absolute moral truths exist?
- Is absolute truth defined by the Bible?
- Did Jesus Christ live a sinless life?
- Is God the all-powerful and all-knowing Creator of the universe, and does He still rule it today?
- Is salvation a gift from God that cannot be earned?
- Is Satan real?
- Does a Christian have a responsibility to share their faith in Christ with others?
- Is the Bible accurate in all of its teachings?

Did you answer yes to these? Only 9% of born-again believers did. But what's more important than your "yes" to these questions is whether your life shows it. Granted, we are all sinners and fall short, but most of our gut reactions will reflect what we deep-down, honest-to-goodness believe to be real and true.

How Does a Biblical Worldview Get Diluted?

Here is the big problem. Non-biblical worldview ideas don't just sit in a book somewhere waiting for people to examine them. These ideas bombard us constantly via the internet, television, films, music, newspapers, magazines, books, and academia. Because we live in a selfish, fallen world, these ideas can seductively appeal to us, and we often end up incorporating them into our personal worldview. Sadly, we often do this without even knowing it.

For example, most Christians would agree with 1 Thessalonians 4:3 and other Scriptures that command us to avoid sexual immorality. But how often do Christians fall into lust or premarital and extramarital sexual sin? Is it simply because they are weak when tempted, or does it begin much earlier, with the seductive lies from our sexualized society?

Why Does a Biblical Worldview Matter?

If we don't fully believe the truth of God and live it, then our lifestyle will be confusing and misleading. Most of us go through life not recognizing that our personal worldviews have been deeply influenced by the world. Through the media and other influences, and through the secularized American views of history, law, politics, and science, our thinking has been affected more than we realize. We then can be taken "captive through hollow and deceptive philosophy, which depends on human tradition and the basic principles of this world rather than on Christ" (Colossians 2:8).

Seven questions to help us develop a biblical worldview:

1. Is there a God and what is He like?
2. What is the nature and origin of the universe?
3. What is the nature and origin of mankind?
4. What happens to a person after death?
5. Where does knowledge come from?
6. What is the basis of ethics and of morality?
7. What is the significance of human history? Challenge: You owe it to yourself to investigate the answers to the above questions with great sincerity. Life is precious!

"Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind" (Romans 12:2).
